

PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS



Last year, Bishop Thomas John Paprocki issued a dispensation for all Catholics within the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass until further notice. Bishop Paprocki has announced that effective April 11, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation will expire and a modified dispensation will go into effect.

April 11 is celebrated liturgically in the Church as Divine Mercy Sunday on the Second Sunday of Easter, beginning with the Saturday anticipated Masses the evening before. As Bishop Paprocki wrote beautifully in his *Catholic Times* column, “The Easter season is a very fitting time to renew our commitment to worship Our Lord every weekend in commemoration of His Resurrection and to pray for God’s Divine Mercy to heal the sick and bring an end to this pandemic.”

Under the modified dispensation, most Catholics will be obligated to attend Mass, but others will continue to be dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass and Holy Days, including:

- Those 65 years of age or older;
- Those at risk for severe illness due to underlying medical conditions as described by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;
- Those who care for the sick, homebound, or infirmed;
- Women who are pregnant;
- Those who cannot be accommodated at Mass because the church was at safe-distancing capacity.

Those who are sick, have a fever, exhibit flu-like symptoms, or who have good reason to think they are asymptomatic of a contagious illness such as COVID-19, are excused from attending Mass and do not require a dispensation. In fact, they are morally obliged not to attend Mass to avoid putting others at risk.

You might be thinking, why is there an obligation to go to Mass? The Mass obligation is an integral part of the sabbath, as giving right worship and gratitude to God and participating in the Eucharistic Sacrifice. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* describes the Sunday Mass obligation as follows: “The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason, the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin ([CCC 2181](#)).”

When we become distracted by other activities and things that seem more important than obeying God’s command to keep holy the sabbath and fulfill our Sunday Mass obligation, we should be concerned that we have begun to lose sight of what is most important. We owe gratitude and worship to God, and we should embrace the opportunity to receive God in the Liturgy of the Word and, most importantly, in the Eucharist.

We must also remember that as members of the Church, we are the body of Christ. Worshipping together is a beautiful way we join ourselves as believers with Jesus.

Our parish and others across the diocese will continue to take measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 such as some pews being roped off to allow for safe distancing, hand sanitizer is present in several locations of the church, the priest sanitizes his hands before distributing communion, churches are cleaned and sanitized, and masks are worn, among other safety measures.

You are encouraged to visit dio.org/backtomass where you can read Bishop Paprocki’s letter and read answers to frequently asked questions about the modified dispensation. We look forward with great joy to seeing you and worshipping together. It’s time... welcome back to Mass!

Welcome Back!

We warmly welcome back
all those who have been away
this past year
because of the pandemic!

A few notes to help you in your return:

- We have seating in the church and overflow seating in the hall.
- Ushers will be available to help you find a place to sit.
- Please sit at least 6 feet away from people who are not in your same household.
- Please use hand sanitizer as you enter.
- Please wear your mask...
 - * as you enter and until you are safely seated
 - * if you are out of your seat and as you go up for Communion
 - * anytime you are closer than 6 feet to someone outside of your household
 - * if you wish to sing along with the choir
- In order to minimize movement, Communion will be at the end of Mass—after the Dismissal and the Prayer to St. Michael. You may leave directly after receiving Communion or you may go back to your pew/seat to pray.
- If you are seated in the hall, you will come into the church for Communion.
- The sign of peace is to be exchanged without physical contact.
- There will be no collection of the weekly offering during Mass, you are invited to drop your donations in the basket at the back of the church.
- The restroom occupancy limit is 2 people.
- The kitchen is closed, if you need water, small bottles are provided in the hallway by the restrooms.
- To avoid spreading germs through common-use items, missals are not provided in the pews—we do have a limited number of personal missals that you can take with you to keep.
- Bulletins will be available to pick up as you leave.
- Holy water fonts for blessing yourself as you enter the church are not available at this time—however, next week we will have small holy water bottles available for you to take with you.

REMINDER: Don't forget to make your reservations for Holy Week/Easter Masses! Call the parish office where you would like to attend. For Virden, you may also make your reservations online via the parish website.

HOLY WEEK 2021:

HOW TO OBTAIN AN PLENARY INDULGENCE:

A plenary indulgence is a grace granted by the Catholic Church through the merits of Jesus Christ, Mary and all the saints to remove the temporal punishment due to sin. The indulgence applies to sins already forgiven. A plenary indulgence cleanses the soul as if the person had just been baptized. A plenary indulgence can be obtained during Holy Week for oneself or for a deceased person if one of the following works established by the Church is performed.

Holy Thursday

1. If during the solemn reservation of the Blessed Sacrament (typically on a side altar), which follows the Mass of the Lord's Supper, you recite or sing the Eucharistic hymn "Tantum Ergo."
2. If you adore the solemnly reserved Blessed Sacrament for a half hour.

Good Friday

1. If you venerate the Cross in the solemn celebration of the Lord's Passion.
2. If you piously participate in the Stations of the Cross

Holy Saturday

1. If two or more people pray the Holy Rosary.
2. If you attend the celebration of the Easter Vigil at night and renew your baptismal promises, which is part of the liturgy of that Mass.

Conditions in all cases:

In order to obtain the plenary indulgence, in addition to performing the specific works mentioned above, the following conditions must be fulfilled:

- A plenary indulgence requires that the individual be in the state of grace by the completion of the acts, and have complete detachment from sin. The person must also sacramentally confess their sins and receive Communion, up to about 20 days before or after the indulgenced act.
- A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences.
- For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate Holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.
- The prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father is left up to the choice of the individual.



Abstinence - abstain from meat (ages 14+)

Fast - Only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed (ages 18-59)

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.





A LETTER FROM ILLINOIS BISHOPS

Our Illinois bishops today issued a letter to Catholics across the state, urging them to contact their state lawmakers and tell them to reject a current effort to repeal Illinois' parental notice of abortion law. Please contact your lawmakers and tell them to vote "No" on House Bill 1797 and Senate Bill 2190. If the law is repealed it will eliminate a critical safeguard that protects young girls from abuse of human traffickers and rapists.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the diocesan bishops of Illinois, write today out of great concern. Bills have been introduced before the Illinois General Assembly to repeal Illinois' Parental Notice of Abortion Act. They are **House Bill 1797** and **Senate Bill 2190**. The enactment of this legislation would lead to tragic and irreversible outcomes.

The Parental Notice of Abortion Act simply requires that when a minor girl seeks to have an abortion, a parent or guardian is notified 48 hours before the procedure. The obvious hope of the law is that parents, by their deep love and moral obligation, will act to protect, support and guide their children. In every other facet of life, we are taught - and we teach - that parental involvement is key to the child's best interest. Repealing the Act is nothing less than an invasion into the sacred space of family life by the state, with no provision to support the minor emotionally, humanely or materially at a critical moment in her life.

It is unfortunately true that not all young people come from loving homes. In these cases, when the threat of abuse or neglect outweighs the rights of parents, the current law allows a young girl the opportunity to declare in writing that there is abuse, or she can seek an emergency hearing before a judge to explain her situation. We acknowledge that this can be emotionally difficult; however, such difficulty must be weighed against the harm done when our laws effectively undermine family life by separating children from the care of parents who love them the most. The state should do everything to support families, not destabilize them.

The existing Parental Notice of Abortion Act provides important safeguards against the evils of sexual abuse and human trafficking. If a minor girl can be taken by any adult man to an abortion clinic, in the hopes of erasing the evidence of his abuse, what protection exists outside of the girl's parent or guardian

being informed? Why would we want to create such a dangerous environment?

Simply put, the Parental Notice of Abortion Act works. According to statistics gathered by the Illinois Department of Public Health, since the law's final enactment by the Illinois Supreme Court in 2013, abortions performed on minors in Illinois have decreased over 30 percent. The lives saved by this law are real and present among us.

These are the reasons every state in the Midwest and 37 states overall have laws requiring some form of parental involvement in the decision of a minor to have an abortion. Illinois has been among those states for 8 years and no obvious problems or detriments have been publicly exposed. The repeal of Parental Notice of Abortion is a tragic solution in search of a problem.

So what can you do? As Catholics of good will, we call on you to engage your elected officials - state representatives, state senators and the Governor - and urge them to oppose **House Bill 1797** and **Senate Bill 2190**.

Possible methods of contact include phone calls, letters, emails, and Zoom meetings between legislators and you, their concerned constituents. For all of these efforts, you will need to be able to identify your legislators and secure the appropriate contact information. Here is how:

Visit the Catholic Conference of Illinois' website - www.ilcatholic.org - scroll nearly to the bottom of the homepage, click on "Find Your Legislator" and input the asked-for information. Doing this will identify one's state elected officials, and simply clicking on their names will provide the contact information.

In our concern for all human life, and particularly for the struggles of young girls in these difficult circumstances and their unborn children, we ask you to participate in this effort. Together we are strong, and we can make a difference. Thank you.
